



Brad Berry is the Yamhill County District Attorney having first been elected in November 1996 and was elected to his 7th term, beginning in January, 2020.

He is an Oregon State University graduate and received his law degree in 1979 from Gonzaga University. Mr. Berry previously served as a deputy district attorney and was in a private litigation practice in Newberg for twelve years until his election.

He is a past president of the Oregon District Attorneys Association. In August of 2005, he was elected to be the Oregon State representative to the National District Attorney's Association Board of Directors and has served as Vice President of NDAA.

Along with other statewide issues, he has been actively involved in the Attorney General's Victims' Rights Compliance Project as well as other victims' rights initiatives. He serves as Chair of the National District Attorneys Association Victims' Rights Committee and previously co-chaired the American Bar Association Victims' Committee. He has been a long serving member of the OSB Criminal Law Section executive committee, having twice served as Chair. He is active in statewide legislative issues, testifying on behalf of ODAA, and his office, on important legislation.

Mr. Berry has been a frequent law enforcement instructor, an instructor for the Oregon District Attorney's Association and the National District Attorney's Association. He formerly taught for both Mount Hood and Portland Community Colleges. He has instructed at Oregon State Bar continuing legal education seminars and at the annual Oregon Judicial Conference.

Lastly, he enjoys and is a frequent community speaker educating on current law enforcement related issues to service clubs, senior groups, chambers of commerce and other local institutions. He and his wife, reside in Newberg.
